

## Class Features

### Selective Call Rejection

With selective call rejection, you can program your phone to reject calls from any number you place on your call rejection list. When your service is turned "on", any callers on this list will hear an announcement that you are not accepting calls at this time. All others will ring through as usual.

### Distinctive Ringing— Teen Ring

You make a list of special callers, your phone will use a special ring to announce calls from those numbers.

Use this feature to help you recognize those important calls that you don't want to miss from family and special friends.

### Selective Call Acceptance

You can program your phone to accept only those calls from a special list of people. When your service is "turned on," your phone will accept only calls from those in your Selective Call Acceptance list. All others will hear an announcement that you're not accepting calls at this time.

This list that you create here is separate from any other list you may be using for other class features.

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## Class Features

### Automatic Callback

You can save time dialing busy numbers over and over! Your phone rings as soon as the line is free, and automatically connects you!

If you hear a busy signal when you dial, press & release the “switch hook.” Listen for a special tone. Press \*66. If the line is still busy, hang up! Your phone will check the number you called for up to 30 minutes. A special callback ring alerts you if the line becomes free. You can then place your call..

### Selective Call Forwarding

If you don’t want to miss that special call, use Selective call forwarding.. With this service, you can program your phone to forward only those calls from a special list of numbers to another number—such as your cell phone.

When your service is turned “on”, calls from the numbers on your list will be re-routed to your “forward-to” numbers. All other numbers will ring to your telephone as usual.

### Automatic Recall

Couldn’t get to the phone in time, you can still find out who called. Return the call by dialing a simple code.

\*Lift handset and listen for a normal dial tone.

\*If you were already on the phone and ignored a call waiting tone, press and quickly release the “switch hook.”

\*Press \*69. Your Call will go through like a normal call. If the line is busy, hang up. Your phone will keep trying the line for up to 30 minutes. A special callback ring alerts you if the line becomes free, then just lift the handset to automatically place the call.

### Caller ID/Call Waiting

Works with Caller ID (you must have Caller ID service). Allows you to see who is calling you while your are on the phone. It displays the number calling on your phone or Caller ID equipment.

### Caller ID

When you receive a call, the name and telephone number of the person calling you will be shown on your Caller ID display screen.

When you receive a call, wait until your telephone completes the first ringing signal. The name and number of the person calling you will automatically appear on your display. If you choose to answer the call, the number will remain on the screen until you or the caller hangs up.

Subscription to Caller ID and the purchase of a display telephone or an add-on-display unit required for the service.

If the Letter “P” or Private appears on your screen, the caller may have blocked the display of their name and number by pressing \*67 (or dialing 1167 on a rotary phone) before placing the call. You can choose whether or not to answer the call.

If “unknown name,” “unknown number,” out of area, or “O” appears, the caller is in an area that does not support Caller ID services.
